

मुंबईतील २६/११ हल्ल्यातील मास्टरमाईड तहवूर राणाला भारतात आणणार

अमेरिकी कोर्टाचा निकाल



मुंबई (विशाल कारंडे) : मुंबईतील भ्याड असा २६/११ दहशतवादी हल्ला डोक्यासमोर आल्यास आजही अंगावट शहारे उमटतात. या हल्ल्यात पोलिसांसह अनेकांना आपला जीव गमवावा लागला होता. अशात या हल्ल्यासंदर्भातील एक माहिती समोर येत आहे. त्यानुसार, २६/११ दहशतवादी हल्ल्यात सहभागी असलेला पाकिस्तानी वंशाचा कॅनडाचा व्यापारी तहवूर राणा याला लवकरच भारताच्या ताब्यात दिले जाण्याची शक्यता वर्तवली जात आहे. तहवूर राणा याला भारतात आणण्याची प्रक्रिया राजनैतिक माध्यमातून सुरू आहे.

हल्ल्यातील सहभागीबद्दल भारताकडे प्रत्यार्पणाचा विरोध करणारी याचिका फेटाळली. प्रत्यार्पणाचा आदेश योग्य होता हे सिद्ध करण्यासाठी भारताने राणाविरुद्ध पुरेसे पुरावे सादर केले आहेत, असे न्यायालयाने म्हटले आहे.

२६/११ च्या हल्ल्याप्रकरणी मुंबई पोलिसांनी आरोपपत्रात राणाच्या नावाचा समावेश केला होता. त्याच्यावर पाकिस्तानच्या इंटर-सर्व्हिसेस इंटेलिजन्स (ISI) आणि दहशतवादी संघटना लष्कर-ए-तैयबाचा सक्रिय सदस्य म्हणून काम केल्याचा आरोप आहे. राणाने मुंबई हल्ल्याचा मास्टरमाईड

डेविड कोलमन हेडलीला मदत केल्याचेही आरोपपत्रात म्हटले आहे, ज्याने हल्ल्यासाठी मुंबईतील ठिकाणांचा शोध घेतला होता. न्यायालयाच्या म्हणण्यानुसार, भारत आणि अमेरिका यांच्यातील प्रत्यार्पण करारामध्ये नॉन-बीस इन इडेम अपवाद आहे. जेव्हा आरोपीला त्याच गुन्हातून आधीच दोषी ठरवण्यात आले आहे किंवा निर्दोष मुक्त केले गेले आहे, तेव्हा हे लागू होते. राणाविरुद्ध भारतात लावण्यात आलेले आरोप हे अमेरिकी कोर्टात चाललेल्या खटल्यांपेक्षा वेगळे आहेत. त्यामुळे idem अपवादामध्ये गैर-बीआयएस लागू होत नाही.

'Without Him Series Might Have Been One-Sided': McGrath Lauds Bumrah's Solo Efforts In BGT

New Delhi - The legendary Australian pacer, Glenn McGrath reckons that Jasprit Bumrah's stellar show in the ongoing Border-Gavaskar series has prevented the five-match affair from being a lopsided contest in favour of Australia. Bumrah has been the best bowler in the series having collected 30 wickets at an average of just 12.83. But India's poor batting and lack of proper plans have let them down, resulting in the side trailing 1-2 in the series. "He has been a massive part of the Indian team and without him, the series might have been more one-sided and what he does is special," McGrath told media persons on the sidelines of his foundation's cancer awareness event here. The 54-year-old was a feared fast bowler during his time. McGrath has been actively involved in cancer awareness programmes



after losing his wife to the disease back in 2008. The former Australian international has been following the ongoing series and remains in awe of Bumrah's skills with the ball. "Terrific young guy who has found a way to adapt

Absolutely incredible how he powers into bowl the last few steps," McGrath said of Bumrah's short run-up. The legendary bowler also saw similarities between Bumrah and himself when it comes to the hyper-extension of the bowling arm. "Got a little bit of hyper extension which I used to have as well. He is coping with it, he has incredible control both ways, guess they are managing him well. I am a massive fan

of Jasprit," said the lanky former bowler, who was nicknamed 'Pigeon' by his teammates for his thin legs. The World Cup winner has also worked with the MRF Pace Foundation in Chennai and remains impressed with the talents that are being produced within the country. He also tipped Prasad Krishna to have a bright future in the bowling side of things. "India, with 1.4 billion people, has absolute passion for the game of

cricket. Working with MRF Pace Foundation for the last 12 years, we have Prasad Krishna, who is in the squad," he commented. "He is a good young bowler and I think, they will have a good career ahead of him. There's no shortage of players and (it is) not just the bowlers but also batters like Yashasvi Jaiswal. What's good about these young players is they are fearless. We have got Sam Konstas who is similar," he added.



Ex-cricketers shocked by dressing room leaks from Australia Tests

New Delhi - Former cricketers Irfan Pathan and Sreevats Goswami have criticised leaks from the Indian dressing room during the Border-Gavaskar Trophy, following a report by The Indian Express detailing coach Gautam Gambhir's scathing remarks after the Boxing Day Test defeat to Australia. Pathan emphasised that dressing room conversations are sacred and should remain confidential, while Goswami condemned the breach, calling it "not on." According to the report, Gautam Gambhir delivered a no-nonsense address to the team after their 184-run defeat in the Boxing Day Test, saying he "has had enough". Gambhir, visibly frustrated, reportedly criticised the players for prioritising their "natural game" over the needs of the situation. Without naming individuals, he expressed his disappointment at the lack of adaptability, making it clear that such an approach was no longer acceptable. The report further states that Gambhir, who assumed the coaching role in July, admitted to giving the players freedom over the past six months but announced a stricter stance moving forward. He warned that players unwilling to adhere to his pre-determined team strategies would be shown the door, signalling a significant shift in his approach to managing the squad. The team management, led by head coach Gautam Gambhir and captain Rohit Sharma, has come under intense scrutiny following India's recent poor results in Test cricket. India suffered a historic 0-3 whitewash at home against New Zealand in October-November, marking their first-ever clean sweep in a home Test series.

Jasprit Bumrah named captain, Cummins ignored in Australian media's Test Team of 2024

New Delhi - Star India fast bowler Jasprit Bumrah has been named captain of the Test team of 2024 by cricket.com.au. Notably, Bumrah had a phenomenal year with the ball as he finished as the highest wicket-taker in Tests with 71 wickets from 13 matches (26 innings) at an average of 14.92 with 5 five-wicket hauls to his name. The Indian pace spearhead has been making giant strides in international cricket with his performances as he recently became the bowler with the best bowling average with more than



200 wickets. He's also the leading wicket-taker of the ongoing Test series against Australia with 30 scalps to his name from four matches

show with the captaincy of the team. Apart from him, Yashasvi Jaiswal has been also picked as the opener for his tremendous exploits with the bat in the year. Jaiswal finished the year as the second-highest run-scorer of the year with 1478 runs from 15 matches (29 innings) at an average of 54.74 with nine fifties and three centuries. Meanwhile, Australia captain Pat Cummins failed to make it to the XI. Cummins had a good year with the ball with 37 scalps from nine matches (18 innings) at an average of 24.02 with two five-wicket hauls. With the bat,

he scored 306 runs with one half-century. Apart from Cummins, only Alex Carey and Josh Hazlewood were the two Australians in the team. Ben Duckett, Joe Root, Rachin Ravindra, Harry Brook, Kamindu Mendis, Matt Henry and Keshav Maharaj also made it to the team. Rohit Sharma And Gautam Gambhir Set For Showdown Talks With BCCI After BGT: Report

New Delhi - Rohit Sharma's performance has been under severe scrutiny after India's shambolic defeat in the Melbourne Test. Alongside Rohit, questions have been raised over Gautam Gambhir's credentials as head coach of the Indian Cricket Team. Rohit has endured very poor outings in the ongoing Border Gavaskar Trophy having mustered only 31 runs in the last 5 innings on Australian soil. His underwhelming batting form might have affected his judgement as the leader as some of his on-field decisions have also faced questions. As per several reports Ajit Agarkar has had talks with Rohit in a bid to steady the boat. But according to a Cricbuzz report, no such talks have taken place and all the discussions will be held after the BGT. The reports also added



that unless Rohit makes himself unavailable for the 5th Test, he will lead the team in Sydney. Rohit admitted that things haven't gone their way. As quoted by Cricbuzz he said, "I stand where I am

If those things don't fall in place, that's a big disappointment." Not only Rohit, but Gautam Gambhir's role is also under focus as per the report. The former KKR captain replaced Rahul Dravid at the helm, but it has been a rocky start. Following the 3-0 thrashing at the hands of New Zealand at home, India's performance in Australia has also not been satisfactory. Ravichandran Ashwin's sudden retirement also sparked major doubts but it has emerged Gambhir didn't have any kind of involvement behind Ashwin's mid-series retirement. However, he will be asked to simplify the matter in the near future.
